ZERO HUNGER

8/10 of Seri Alam's 770 families struggle to generate enough money to meet their basic needs.

20% of Malaysian children are stunted due to malnutrition.



RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION

4,000 tonnes of edible food is thrown away each day in Malaysia.

TLFP currently has rescued over 23 million meals that would otherwise end up in landfill.

CLIMATE ACTION

The Malaysian government has pledged to achieve 45% CO2 reduction by 2030.

TLFP currently prevent a monthly average of 262.5 tonnes of greenhouse gases from entering our atmosphere by diverting food waste.



GREEN PLATES PROJECT

FROM JANUARY TO APRIL

DONATIONS

Surplus food, which would otherwise have ended up in landfills, is collected from markets importers and companies including Pasar Borong, Nestlé, Danone, Unilever and P&G.

80% of food donated is fresh produce and the remainder is dried goods and fast-moving consumer goods.

DISTRIBUTION

Surplus fresh produce is delivered bi-weekly on Thursdays to PPR Seri Alam by TLFP trucks.

A representative from Seri Alam collects dried goods and fast-moving consumer goods from the TLFP location.

FEEDING FAMILIES

Collaboration with PPR Seri Alam's resident management ensures fair distribution among the 3,869 people in 770 families.

63,900 MEALS

4 MONTHS

22,000KG of fresh nutritious food distributed

16,900 - 33,000 KG of CO2 emissions averted
