Extended Producer Responsibility

Definition

"an environmental policy approach in which a producer's responsibility for a product is extended to the post-consumer stage of a product's life cycle."



Responsibility shifting towards producers

Shifting the responsibility of post-consumer stage of products away from municipalities towards producers



Provision of incentives to producers when designing products that take into account environmental considerations




Producer Responsibility Organisation

A Producer Responsibility Organisation (PRO) is key for organisation, financing, administration and control of an EPR system


